Instructions for Water Cycle Circle Book

- Print out circle sheets. You should have 2 pages—page 1 and page 2. Each page has 2 circles on it so you will have 4 circles in all. Each circle has a different activity on it.
- 2. Art supplies: scissors, glue sticks, colored pencils, crayons and pencils
- 3. You can cut the circles out first, or draw on them first and then cut them out.
- 4. Activity descriptions:
 - a. 1st Circle, page 1: What are a few ways that you can save water at your house? (Think through all the different processes of the water cycle!)
 - i. Some hints:
 - 1. Check water fixtures for leaks (i.e. shower head, toilet, sink faucets, hose connectors)
 - 2. Collect precipitation (i.e. a rain barrel)
 - 3. Don't run the dishwasher and/or washing machine until they are full
 - 4. Use a shower bucket to collect the water before it gets warm—use for watering plants!
 - 5. Use a broom, not a hose, to clean sidewalks and driveways
 - 6. To reduce evaporation water loss, water your yard/flowers/garden in the morning and not when windy
 - 7. Add organic matter, mulch and/or pumice (absorbent rock) to increase water absorption from precipitation and reduce water loss from evaporation
 - 8. Plant trees for shade—they can cool the house and yard while storing carbon and providing water vapor from transpiration
 - b. 2nd Circle, page 1: Water Cycle Diagram
 - i. No need to label anything, it is already completed.
 - ii. Use the colored pencils and crayons to add some color!
 - c. 1st Circle, page 2: Match the terms to the correct definition
 - i. Read the Water Cycle Story circle for more context, if needed.
 - d. 2nd Circle, page 2: The Water Cycle Story
 - i. First read the story, then draw a picture at the bottom of the circle, if time.
- 5. Once all of the circles are cut out, fold each of the four circles along the grey dotted line down the center.
- 6. With a glue stick, glue the blank white backs of the folded circles and adhere all sides together to form a circle book. See images and assembly instructions below:

Step 1: Start with 2 folded circles, blank white sides facing up. Put glue on one of the circles. Match the unglued circle up to the glued one, and stick them together



Step 2: Place glue on a third folded circle, line it up to one of the blank white backs of the already glued-together circles, and stick it on

Step 3: Put glue on the 2 white backs showing on the 3 circles already sticking together. Line up the last, un-glued folded circle and stick both sides on



Step 4: You're done! The completed Water Cycle Circle Book should look like this!
